It did get long for normal guys like me but give credit to the club; they ended it just about the time you were just starting to get that uneasy feeling in your stomach. Did you hear that Roselawn, we really don't need to ride that first section again at the end of the race. Sorry just me babbling cause I am out of shape.

Anyway Nick Farringer won it with a 25. I don't know how old Nick is but he does not look a day over 18. And he had to beat a lot of really fast people. Rodney Judson was second with Jeff Anderson third. I think Cody Mastin was next but overall A had the same score and I didn't get that kids name either. Another young gun and overall B would have been about 8th overall with yet another fast kid that I don't know. Did you hear me, its looks like in this part of the country finally there is about to be a transition to a new generation of really fast young guys. That's what I am really happy about! If these guys keep progressing and we as the older bunch get the prestige back into Enduros like the old days, the sport now has the elements to go to the next level.
